Regional Network of Programs, Inc. (RNP) is a private, non-profit behavioral health provider serving Connecticut. Its primary mission is to serve the economically disadvantaged / afflicted person by using a variety of individualized and diversified approaches to person-centered care.

Founded in 1972, RNP has grown to meet the needs of the community. RNP employs a highly trained, diverse and qualified staff of professionals to provide substance abuse treatment, case management for the mentally impaired and homeless at numerous locations in Connecticut. All services are based on a Recovery Model of Care which individualizes treatment to support and encourage an individual's recovery and increased stability.

Today, the Organization's scope of services provide a continuum of care in the following areas: medication-assisted treatment, individual and group drug and alcohol counseling, substance abuse and mental health education, information and referral, a variety of counseling programs for youth and adults; facilities for individuals recovering from psychiatric disorders and a wide range of housing options for the homeless.

SEAVIEW APARTMENT PROGRAM

The Seaview Apartment Program provides permanent, supportive housing for sixteen individuals who are chronically homeless at the time of admission and who are also living with psychiatric disorders, substance use disorders and/or HIV/AIDS. This supportive housing program is unique in its program design in several ways. First, support services are located on-site which includes case management, life skills training, crisis intervention and individual and group counseling. In an effort to support the emphasis on skill building and life skill training, this program is located directly on a bus line. In addition, laundry facilities are located on-site at no cost to those living within the program. Second, evidence-based treatment is provided on site. This includes Seeking Safety for individuals with a history of trauma, Illness Management and Recovery for individuals with co-occurring disorders, relapse prevention for sustained recovery and gender specific group services. This HUD funded program combines the essential elements of permanent housing with comprehensive supportive, wrap around services.

PROSPECT HOUSE

Prospect House, a division of Regional Network of Programs, Inc. (RNP), provides emergency shelter to thirty-two adults on a daily basis. Prospect House provides comprehensive case management services to meet the varied and complex needs of individuals who are homeless. The case management program at Prospect House includes assessment, transportation, life skills training, individual, group and family work.

Prospect House is also able to offer free medical services through a collaborative relationship with Southwest Community Health Center. In addition, psychiatric and substance abuse assessment services are provided on site.

URBAN MODEL PROGRAM

The Urban Model Program offers both transitional and supporting housing opportunities for individuals who are homeless and living with both psychiatric and substance use disorders. The “*transitional*” housing component of the program operates out of Prospect House shelter. In collaboration with CASA, Urban Model program participants are provided with comprehensive substance abuse assessment and treatment principles of Motivational Enhancement Therapy. The “*supportive*” housing component of the program is located off-site at another facility within Bridgeport, where individuals may live for a maximum of 18 months. During each level of housing, extensive case management services are provided by a diverse team. A team approach with a heavy emphasis on Illness Management and Recovery, relapse prevention and skill building is provided to each client. Staff are on site for each facility 24 hours a day. The Urban Model program is funded by DMHAS and has a capacity of 13 individuals.
